Did you Know?

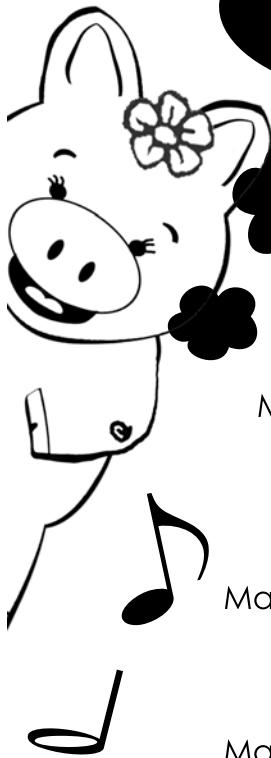
The color green was picked for paper currency in the U.S. because green pigment at the time was readily available.
